Immediate Theatre has worked with young people and communities in Hackney and East London for 28 years. We are committed to increasing access to the arts for all and we believe in the transformative power of theatre and the arts to all our lives, and the importance of giving people a voice. Our purpose is to involve communities in creative projects that inspire wellbeing, break down barriers and engage people in the process of personal and social change.

Our Objectives:

- Providing inspiring participatory arts programmes, enabling people to reach their potential and preventing exclusion and social isolation
- Creatively exploring social issues, engaging people in the process of change and encouraging and enabling them to influence decision making
- Improving health and wellbeing and increasing life skills and employability through engagement in the arts





Youth Programmes

Estate-based Youth Theatre

We have been providing high quality open access youth theatres on estates in Hackney since 1998. The programme has engaged thousands of participants who do not traditionally have access to arts opportunities and are supported by Peer Facilitators, young people paid LLW. We currently run nine groups in Hackney and Newham. All our sessions are free, and inclusive.

Speech Bubbles

Speech Bubbles programme is a year-long, evidence-based drama intervention for children in KS1 who have speech, language and communication Needs. The programme is designed to give young children an opportunity to have fun telling stories and acting them out, and has a particular emphasis on supporting children to gain confidence and develop their physical and verbal communication skills.

Interactions

Interactions works with 13-19-year-olds who are excluded or at risk of exclusion, providing access to positive creative activities through which they can improve their academic attainment and achieve their goals.

Working With Adults

Pathways to Employment

We provide creative programmes and one-to-one support to help participants develop their skills & explore potential career opportunities. This includes weekly sessions for the Hackney Young Collective (18-30) and the Indie Project for people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities aged 25+.

Theatre Exchange

A weekly theatre group for over 60's - we are currently rehearsing a tour of the group's fantastic cabaret which will provide much needed entertainment for more isolated older people.

Voices of Change

Voices of Change works with volunteers aged 60+ gathering oral histories from migrant communities in Hackney and Newham and turning these stories into podcasts. We were very proud to launch the Hackney and Newham History Social Club podcasts at Hackney Archives in November 2023

Working In Schools

Immediate Theatre has been using the voices and ideas of our participants to create touring productions for schools since 2005. Our work is co-produced and aims to encourage students to be able to explore vital issues. We also run workshops in schools alongside productions and as independent projects.

This play was initiated through workshops with young people and led to us forming a group exclusively for young women. Abi falase and the writer of our previous production *Pressure Drop* - Anna Bennett also ran a young women's writers group who wrote five short scripts which will be included in the education pack for this project

This audio project is a new endeavor for Immediate
Theatre, recognising the challenges schools face when
trying to accommodate theatre productions. Our aim is to
provide contemporary and relevant drama in a format that
can be used by teachers in the classroom enabling young
people to hear characters that sound like them.
